Quick Facts

Eating vegetarian one day a week for a year is the carbon equivalent to driving [1,160 fewer miles per year](#) — or saving 22 pounds of CO2 emissions.

Always wash full loads of clothes and dishes. Washing machines can use [30 to 60 gallons of water](#) for the wash cycle.

Seal the leaks in your ductwork: leaky ductwork may account for as much as [30% to 50%](#) of cooled and heated indoor air loss. Seal all joints and connections with mastic, a putty-like material available at most hardware stores.

Expert tip: Never use duct tape! It will quickly dry out. Instead, use UL-181 foil tape.

There is about [100%](#) increase in the total recycling in the United States during the past decade.

TerraCycle

The unofficial Sustainability Committee is looking into adopting several office-wide recycling initiatives through a program called [TerraCycle](#). TerraCycle takes previously non-recyclable or hard-to-recycle waste through collection programs called [Brigades](#), and then recycles or [upcycles](#) it

into useful [products](#) such as park benches, recycling bins, placemats, bags, and CD cases. The best part about TerraCycle is that

it's a free program, requiring no shipping payment for sending your waste, and most

Brigades even give participants a small credit (usually around 2¢ per individual item), which they can then donate to the charity of their choice.
